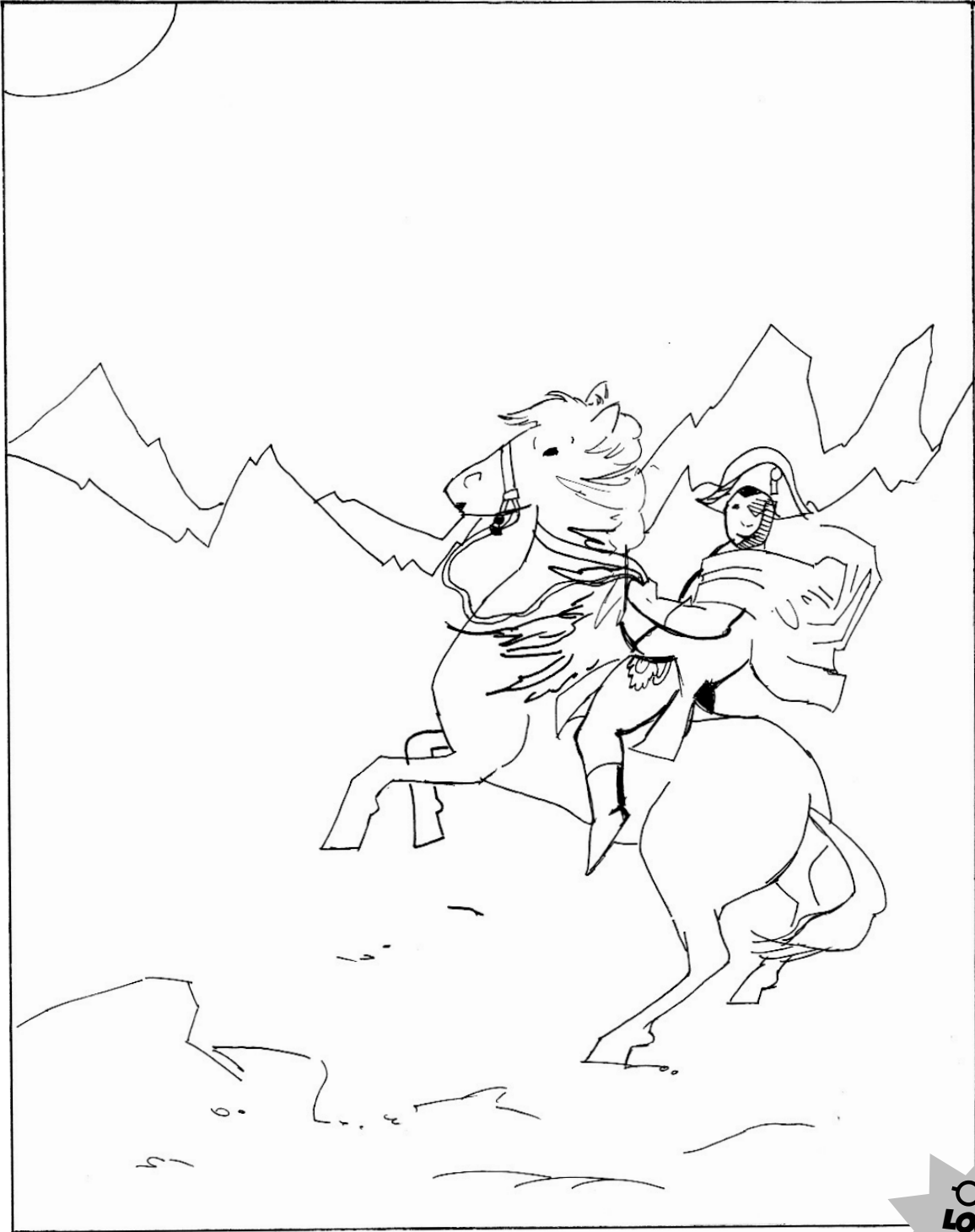




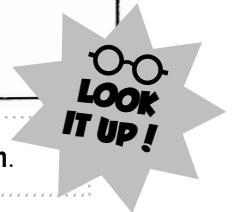
# LAFAYETTE THE LADYBUG COLORING SHEET

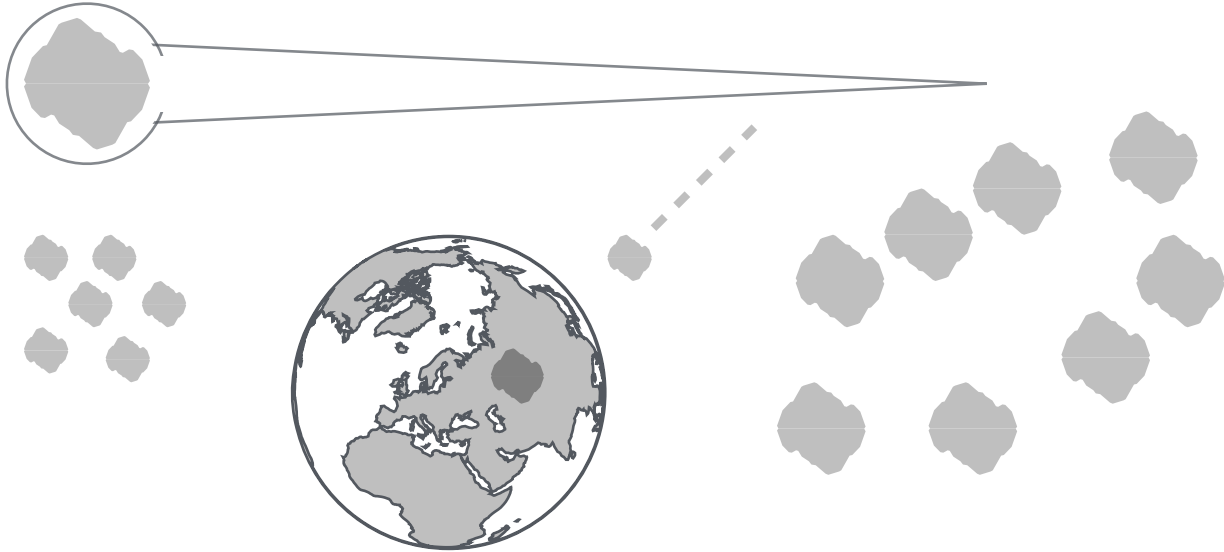

# THE DARK SIDE OF THE SOLAR SYSTEM

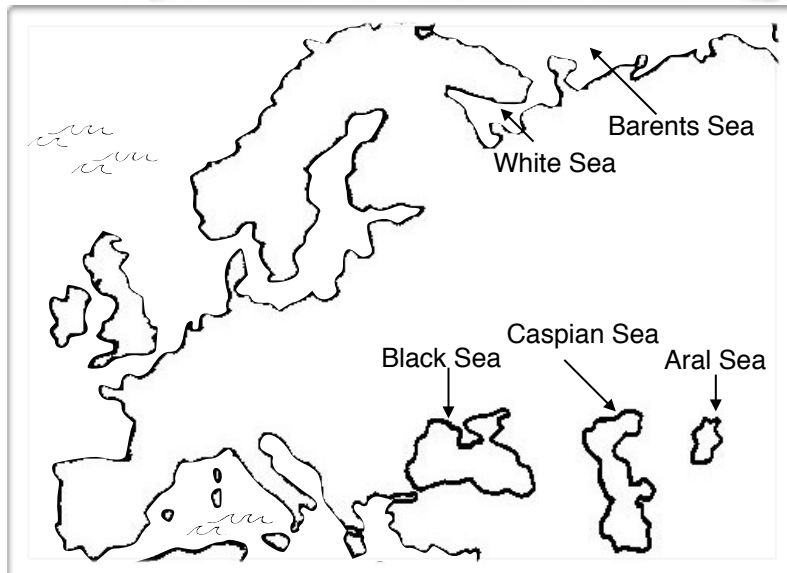
Other than the sun and the planets, there are millions of smaller chunks of rock in our solar system. **Asteroids** are large space boulders that can be over 300 miles across. They form rings called belts that orbit the sun. A **comet** is a chunk of rock and ice surrounded by a tail of gas and dust that streams out behind it. If a comet breaks up, the pieces are called **meteoroids**. These pieces are small enough that they can be pulled in by Earth. If they land on Earth, they are called **meteorites**. **Label the space rocks below.**

### EASTERN EUROPEAN SEAS



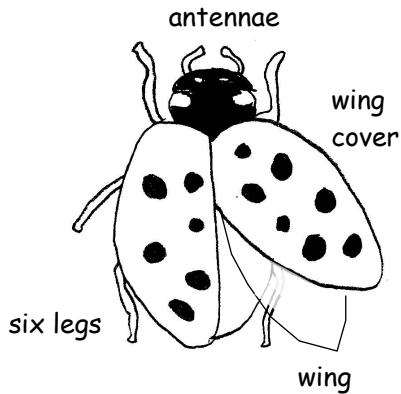

# LADYBUGS



Ladybugs are a type of beetle, because they have hard outer shells covering their delicate wings. It's these shells that make ladybugs so famous. They're red or yellow, with large black spots as decorations. They don't have to be ladies to be beautiful.

A ladybug egg looks like a small, yellowish-white blob on a leaf. A small, six-legged crocodile-looking larva is the ladybug's first life-cycle stage. It will keep growing and growing until it forms a cocoon and hatches into a ladybug!

## Fun facts about ladybugs:

- Ladybugs eat pests, like aphids, and so are valuable to gardens.
- They like to drink—usually water, but sometimes sap and nectar.
- Ladybugs are attracted to coriander, fennel, and dill plants.
- They breathe through little openings in the sides of their bodies.
- These beetles also gather in groups to keep warm when it's cold.
- Lafayette can spray a yellow, stinky liquid out of his arms, just like his father, Lenny!
- The colorful spots mean that ladybugs are poisonous to eat.
