


Flopsy Bunnies' Simile and Metaphor Sack





- 1. Cut out both sides of the sack as one piece.
- 2. Glue the blank side to your notebook.
- 3. Fold the sack in half, so the front opens like a book.
- 4. Color the sack, and label it.
- 5. Cut out, color and write your own similes and metaphors on the veggies and bunnies, and glue them to the inside of the sack.

What are similes and metaphors?

They are both comparisons between two things that are not similar. A simile uses "like" or "as," while a metaphor just states them as they are.

Examples:

Simile: A broccoli floret is like a miniature tree.

Metaphor: Bunnies are bouncy balls.

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
