SCAVENGER HUNT RHYME TIME

Beatrix Potter wrote a collection of rhymes called *Appley Dapply's Nursery Rhymes*. Rhymed words share sounds, such as "pot" and "hot." There are many different types of rhymes, but one of the most common types is *end rhyme*, which is when the rhyming words are placed in the final syllables of a line.

For example:

*In somebody's cupboard
there's everything nice,
Cake, cheese, jam, biscuits
—all charming for mice!*

The activity for this week is to go on a scavenger hunt, and make a rhyme for each item found. Ask a parent, sibling, or friend to hide the items on the scavenger hunt list, such as a hat, an onion, a lettuce leaf, etc. If you don't have these items, you can draw pictures of them, then have someone hide them for you to find.

After you have found the items, make a rhyme for each item in your notebook.
